This is the last Will and Testament  
of me Elizabeth Flint of Charlwood in the County of Surry  
Widow first I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth  
the Wife of Charles Flint of Charlwood aforesaid Yeoman her  
Dower and assigns for ever all my Appurtenances Farms Lands  
Tenements Hereditaments and Real Estate whatsoever and  
wheresoever and all my Goods Chattels Stock in Trade ready  
Money Securities for Money and Personal Estate she or  
paying thereout all my just Debts funeral Expenses charges  
of proving this my Will and the sum of eight hundred Pounds  
which I have now in my Hands In Trust for Elizabeth the  
Wife of Ralph Arnold of Leigh in the said County Yeoman  
as soon as conveniently may be after my decease and lastly  
I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my said  
Daughter Elizabeth Flint sole Executrix of this my last Will  
and Testament hereby revoking all former Wills by me at any  
time heretofore made I do declare this alone to be my last Will  
and Testament In Witness whereof I the said Elizabeth Flint  
the Testatrix have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this twelfth  
day of January in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven  
hundred and seventy four - Elis: Flint. *Es* Signed Sealed  
Published and Declared by the said Elizabeth Flint the Testatrix  
as and for her last Will and Testament in the presence of us  
who in her presence and at her request and in the presence  
of each other of us have hereunto subscribed our Names  
as Witnesses thereto - *Thos. Melmoth Thymmer - Saml. Dupleck


In the 15. day of Nov. 1702.  
Witness with the Will signed, sealed, written, and Credited by Elizabeth Flint the said Testatrix late of Charlwood in the County of Surry widow deceased left behind by Elizabeth Flint wife of Charles Flint the said Testatrix the said Elizabeth Flint and Henry Legh named in the said Will now deceased was granted to Charles Flint the husband and assign of the goods of the said Elizabeth Flint now deceased sworn duly to be true.

This Will was proved at London the twenty eighth day  
of November in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred  
and seventy four before the Worshipful George Harris Doctor  
of Laws Surrogate of the Right Worshipful Sir George Day  
Knight also Doctor of Laws Master Recorder or Commissioner of  
the Prerogative Court of Canterbury lawfully constituted by  
the Oath of Elizabeth Flint (Wife of Charles Flint) the Daughter  
of the deceased and sole Executrix named in the said Will  
to whom Administration was granted of all and singular the  
Goods Chattels and Credits of the said deceased having been first  
sworn duly to administer a definitive Sentence having  
been pronounced and promulged for the Validity of the  
said Will as by the Acts of Court sped thereupon appears.

of health but of sound Mind Memory and Understanding I  
do make and declare this my last Will and Testament in  
manner and form following first I commit my Soul to God



my Creator by the Merits of Jesus Christ our blessed Saviour  
 my Body I leave to the Earth to be decently buried at  
 the direction of my Daughter Mary Guion and I appoint  
 her to be sole Executrix of this my present last will and  
 Testament And I order ~~that~~ she shall be free from all Expenses  
 attending this Execution I give and bequeath to my said a  
 Daughter Mary all and singular my Household Goods Bed  
 and bedding my large Looking Glass Also my Brass Cables  
 and Chairs one half of my Powder also one half of my  
 Cloaths Simons Body and Household Item I give and bequeath  
 to my Daughter Katharine Wife of Francis Castagne one  
 looking Glass one half of my Powder and one half of my  
 Cloaths Simons of Body and Household Also my oldest Suit  
 of Green Red Curting now I order my just Debts to and  
 funeral Expenses to be paid and satisfied Then the rest  
 residue or remainder of my Estate I order the same to be  
 shared between my three Children share alike that is to  
 say one share to my said Daughter Mary one share to my  
 other said Daughter Katharine Wife of Francis Castagne and  
 the other share shall be for my Son James Guion now I  
 the said Mary Guion the Testatrix do declare that this  
 is my last will and Testament In Witness whereof I have  
 hereunto set my Hand and Seal the twenty sixth day of  
 June in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred  
 and fifty nine 1759 - Marie Guion + her mark  Signed  
 Sealed Published and Declared by the said Mary Guion as  
 Testatrix for her last will and Testament in the presence  
 of us Witnesses - Michael Bouquet - Simeon Bernard 1759

**This I do declare** that it is my last will that  
 if I should be dead before my Son James Guion <sup>should</sup> come to  
 England that his share should remain in the Government  
 Stock but if it should happen to pay that should be divided  
 between my two Daughters Katharine Wife of Francis  
 Castagne and Mary Guion and in same time do appoint  
 joint Executrix with my Daughter Mary Guion Dr. John  
 Wife of this my last will and Testament the twenty fifth  
 day of December 1759 - Marie Guion + her mark - Witnesses  
 Mary Phillips - Dr. Marcellat -

**This Will** was proved at London with a Codicil the  
 seventh day of December in the Year of our Lord one  
 thousand seven hundred and seventy four before the  
 worshipful Francis Simpson Doctor of Laws Surrogate of  
 the Right worshipful Sir George May Knight also Doctor of  
 Laws Master Recorder or Comptroller of the Prerogative Court  
 of Canterbury lawfully constituted By the oath of Mary Guion  
 Spinster the Daughter of the deceased and sole Executrix  
 named in the said Will to whom Administration was granted
