I James Glover of N^o 25 Throgmorton Street in the City of London Clerk to Messieurs Travers Smith & Co of the same place Counsel Solicitors in this cause for the above named Defendant make oath and say as follows

1 On Thursday the 26th of February last I personally served Colonel ~~William~~ Perrin of Brompton Court Glass Brompton near Bristol with a Subpoena to attend as a Witness at the hearing of this cause - He was then in bed suffering as he informed me from a wound in his head occasioned by a fall a week or more previously and that in consequence he had been obliged to keep to his bed from that time and receive daily medical attendance - He expressed a great wish to attend and give evidence on behalf of the defendant as he had seen a great deal of the defendant's case of and attention to the wants of the Testatrix but he feared he should not be able to attend in London if the cause came on so soon as the 11th of March now instant

2 He also informed me that his Wife who was also an intended Witness had left home that same day to go some distance to their daughter who was believed to be dying

3 On the 2nd (day of March) instant I received from the defendant a letter in which he stated that Colonel Burrows had informed him that he (Colonel Burrows) would not be able to attend in Court and he accordingly had forwarded a medical certificate to Mr. Mayall the Registrar of the Court (whose signature appeared on the subpoena) to show that he would be unable to attend and give evidence at the hearing.

4 The evidence of the said Colonel Burrows is believed to be important to the defendant's case.
