Testament of  
me Ann Gore of Middlesex in the County of Devon & Somerset in the manner  
following that is to say I Ann Gore do hereby bequeath all my real & personal  
lands & tenements as well in possession as in reversion Goods Chattels & effects  
of what nature or kind soever monies & jewels or trinkets cloaths & all  
my Estate right & interest thereto with all its appurtenances unto my dear  
nephew John Gore son of John Gore & his heirs for ever subject  
nevertheless to the payment of all my just debts & funeral expenses & I do  
hereby nominate & appoint to said John Gore whole sole Executor of this  
my last will & testament hereby revoking all former Wills by me at any time  
heretofore made & declaring this to be my only true last will & testament  
I the said Ann Gore have testifies & signed & sealed & published & declared by the said Ann Gore her testatrix as for & to be her last  
will & testament in the presence of us who have subscribed our names as  
witnesses & are in her presence in the presence of each other & at her  
request - Margaretha Leigh Maria Leigh - John Gore

On the 13<sup>th</sup> October 1812 Admon (with will annexed) was granted to  
John Gore & Joseph Bowden her Executors of John Gore widow  
deceased whilst living her sole executrix & Universal Legatee having been  
first sworn duly to Admin<sup>r</sup>

heretofore made & declare this to be my last will & testament I appoint my  
son Daniel Oliver Gordon Executor as witness my hand this 20<sup>th</sup> day of

Appeared Personally Benjamin & Mary Gordon of Bathwick  
in the County of Bathampton Equiv<sup>l</sup> Ann Gordon of the same place a  
Spinster & widow & her testatrix & her sole & Universal Legatee with Ann  
Gordon wife of the City of Bath widow deceased for sometime before & to  
the time of her death & also her son Daniel & daughter of Bath & Bathwick  
& subscription bearing frequently seen & with subscription her name  
& having been with me & attention viewed & perused the paper & looking  
into the same purporting to be & contain the last will & testament of the said  
deceased beginning thus I Ann Gordon of the City of Bath widow do make  
thus as witness my hand this 20<sup>th</sup> day of February 1807 & thus subscribed  
Ann Gordon & her son & daughter & depose that they do truly & in their  
consciences believe the whole & sign & contents of the said paper & looking  
beginning & ending as aforesaid & also the subscription thereto to be of the  
proper & authenticating of the said Ann Gordon deceased - G. D. Gordon - Ann  
Gordon - On the twentieth day of October 1812 the said Benjamin & Mary Gordon  
& Ann Gordon were duly sworn to the truth of this affidavit by virtue of the  
Commission & are annexed before me - Thomas Mears Commissioner

On the 17<sup>th</sup> October 1812 Admon (with will annexed) was granted to  
Sarah Gordon her Adm<sup>r</sup> of Daniel Oliver Gordon deceased whilst living her  
sole executrix & residuary Legatee having been first sworn duly to Admin<sup>r</sup>
